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- We are done with rebates for Annual Appeal rebate since 2024 campaign has begun. We've received a total of \$21,488 which will go to Outreach. Total income was 6% over projections for the year so far.
- Total expenses were below budget for April and for the year so far. Our net income for the year was \$175,469 -**134%** above projections. Office supplies ran a little more than budgeted, mainly because of postage costs for Annual Appeal letters that were mailed to families. Youth Ministry expenses included program materials, a Middle School event and food. Repairs and Maintenance expenses were for mower repair, gas and topsoil. The grounds look really great! Bank services Fees are now for Pushpay only. Fees are turning out to be a little lower than the old vendor (OSV). Property Taxes - The Archdiocese has changed the process of paying our taxes. Instead of the option to pay twice a year, in April and October, they pay the entire bill in April and we reimburse them. So in December we paid the 2nd half of our 2023 taxes, and in April we paid the taxes for 2024.

Outreach:

- Checking balance was \$4,627 less than the previous month. The total balance includes the \$7,000 for the Outreach truck. A transmission has already been purchased and our Outreach truck is running great!
- Offerings were 10% above projections for April and are 28% above projections for the year so far.
- Net income is 76% above budget for the year so far.
- Utilities Assistance was a lot higher than budget projections. Assistance was provided to 54 households, including several families and senior citizens with disconnect notices. LeeAnn reported that clients in these situations are facing varied circumstances: from

temporary job loss, to dealing with large medical bills, to being unable to work to care for a family member full time. One senior reported that squatters on his property that were stealing from his house and using his power for their RV. This situation was reported to the state of Washington DSHS for follow up. Rental assistance is not available to most Outreach clients at this time. Due to increased need in the community, we have chosen to focus on utility bill assistance for Outreach clients. Food Assistance spending continues to include the monthly food subscription to Farmer Frog. 188 bags of groceries were given out in April.

 Utilities for Outreach includes garbage services and the installation of a water meter so that the potatoes can be watered.

Mass Attendance & Sunday Offerings (Through March 2024)

Last Fiscal Year 2022-23 was the first solid year of recovery after Covid where people returned to attending Mass in person and resumed their giving habits. So comparing our current fiscal year with the previous one gives us a good idea of trends.

Note: December attendance and offerings were not included in this analysis because Christmas falls on a different day of the week each year. When other holidays, such as Guadalupe or Christmas Eve, fall on a Sunday in some years, this may also skew the Sunday comparisons, as loose giving and attendance may be especially affected.

Average Attendance

Following are average weekly attendance comparisons from July through February of last fiscal year (July 2022-February 2023) and during the same period of this fiscal year (July 2023-February 2024):

March attendance was not included in the comparison because Easter 2024 was in March and Easter 2023 was in April, which skewed the numbers. Note that attendance on Easter 2024 was 1,478 and last Easter 2023 was 1,472--not much of an increase.

Sunday Collection Comparisons

- Giving from July to March this fiscal year is up 10% over the same period last fiscal year.
- On average, this fiscal year 70 people give using envelopes and 86 people give online. Last fiscal year, 68 people gave using envelopes and 80 people

 There is no way to tell how many people contribute to the "loose" cash or visitor check giving, but "loose" giving has increased 42% over last fiscal year.

Note that Christmas and Easter giving are not included in this analysis because they are recorded as Holy Day giving instead of regular Sunday giving.
